## BOPAE Drop-off Location



- **Notice:** Please do not drop off BOPAE items at the main gate or BOPAE gate after hours. This is illegal dumping. (City Ordinance FMC 17-104, Punishable by Fine)

## Reminders:

- If going to BOPAE, **Do Not Go Over Scales.** The transfer station entrance is for refuse.
- The City of Franklin Sanitation and Environmental Services Department provides a free service to Williamson Count residents.
- **Alkaline Batteries** no longer contain mercury. These can be disposed of in your household garbage.
- **Electronics** placed at curbside will be collected with your regular trash and **WILL NOT** be recycled.
- **Liquids** brought to BOPAE drop-off site must be in original labeled containers. If liquids are in containers that are no longer have a label, please use the annual household hazardous waste drop-off event coordinated by the Williamson County Solid Waste Department.

- **Electronic Waste:**  
Computers - Laptops and desktop, hard drives should be cleared of any personal information  
All computer components - mice, keyboards, monitors, speakers and cables.  
Electronic Circuit boards and components  
Fax machines, copiers, printers, scanners and modems  
Televisions - flat and tube type  
Telephones - Cell phones and telephone systems (cordless and wired)  
Stereo equipment - CD players, DVD players, VCR's and pagers  
Handheld games & PDA's  
Microwave ovens  
Small appliances (Mixers, Toasters, Coffee Pots, Crock Pots)
- **Residential Medical Equipment:**  
All cables  
\*Most any household electrical item that does not have a compressor
- **Light fixtures**

-15 Gallons of Paint Per Day

-15 Gallons of Clear Sealer Per Day

-5 Gallons of Cooking Oil and Motor Oil Per Day

-5 Computers Per Day

-5 CFL Bulbs and Fluorescent Tubes Per Day



# Responsible Paint Disposal



## LATEX PAINT IS NOT HAZARDOUS.

Don't put cans with liquid latex paint or  
ANY oil paint in the garbage can.



Empty or dried up latex  
paint cans with the lids off  
can go into your garbage  
cart because Latex Paint is  
NOT Hazardous.

*How to dry out latex paint  
for home disposal:*

IF there's an  
inch or less of paint in the can,  
remove lid and let paint dry out. If  
there's more than an inch of paint  
left, mix paint with equal amount  
of cat litter, stir and let dry before  
placing in garbage cart.

## OIL-BASED PAINT IS HAZARDOUS WASTE



Completely empty  
oil-based paint  
cans with the lids  
off can go into  
your garbage cart!

*But...*

Partially full or full cans  
of oil-based paint must  
be taken to a household  
hazardous collection site  
for proper disposal.

**Do not put cans  
containing oil-based  
paint out in your cart  
for pick up.**



- Unlike latex paint, oil-based paint should not be dried out or solidified. **Oil-based paint is flammable whether wet or dry.**
- Never put flammable products, such as oil-based paint or thinner, down any drain or into the garbage.
